Tackling knife crime

British Transport Police (BTP) is conducting a national campaign to tackle knife crime on the railways.

Walk-through metal detectors, similar to those at airports, will be used in an effort to eradicate knife carrying on the railway system. These detectors are fully portable and can be used anywhere at anytime. They will be accompanied by a team of officers, in uniform and plain clothes, who will arrest anyone in possession of weapons.

While the railway is still one of the safest methods of travel, with only one knife-related incident for every 4 million passenger journeys, BTP and our partners aim to reduce this figure even more with your support.

If you see anyone with any type of knife or weapon please call 999 immediately and report it.
