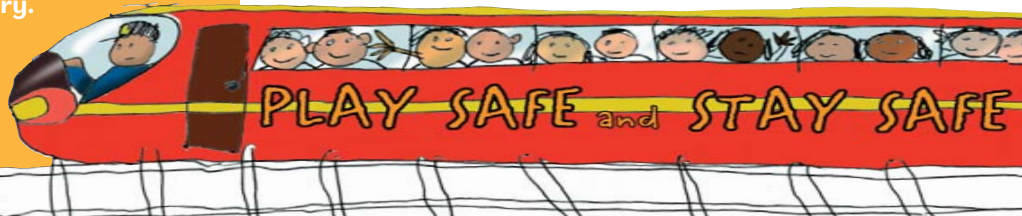

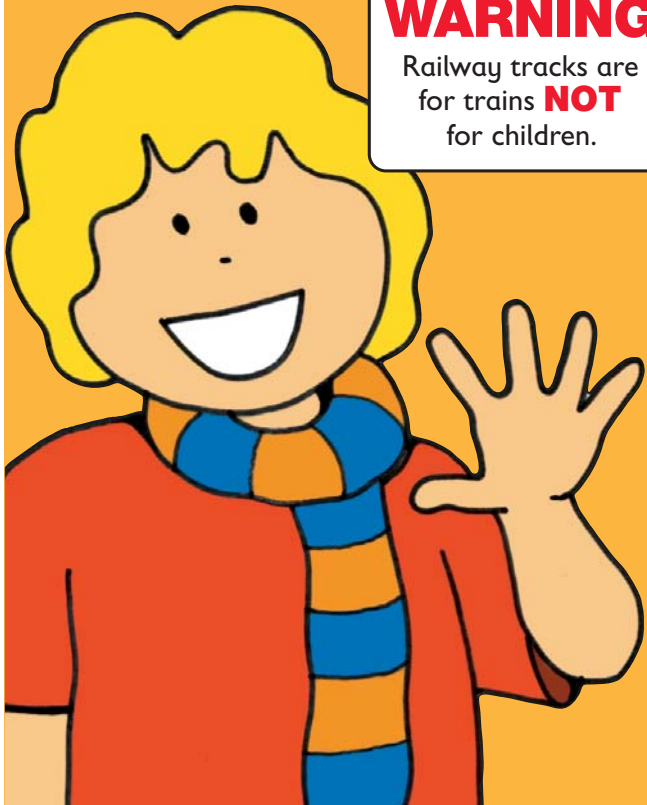
The railway is not a playground.

Playing by the side of the railway, on the tracks or on a railway station platform is very dangerous.

A train goes very fast and cannot stop quickly or steer out of the way like a car.

WARNING

Railway tracks are for trains **NOT** for children.



PLAY SAFE and STAY SAFE

Please remember the
5 Golden Railway Rules

- Rule 1** Never climb over or through a fence by the side of the railway tracks.
- Rule 2** Never climb on a bridge over the railway tracks.
- Rule 3** Never play with a ball or any other toy on a railway station platform.
- Rule 4** Never play with a kite or balloon near electric cables over the railway tracks.
- Rule 5** Never throw stones at a train or put anything on the railway tracks.



Some children who have ignored railway warning signs have been very badly hurt or even killed.

- Some have been killed by trains when they have been playing games near the railway tracks
- Some have been badly burned by the electricity that is used on the railways
- Some have fallen from bridges on to the railway tracks
- Some have been hit by a train when sitting on the edge of a railway station platform
